

Hungarian athletes at the modern Olympic Games

In this collection I show all the Hungarian athletes and contestants – apart from their results – who represented Hungary in some of the events at the modern Olympic Games.

In Chapter 1 I describe the certain stages of qualifying for the Olympics, because in the period from the beginning (1876) the higher and higher number of participants caused bigger and bigger problems and that is why the ones who wanted to compete had to get the right for taking part in the Olympics in the qualification competitions.

In Chapter 2 I make the contestants known by their kinds of sport. I compiled the order of the sports on the basis of getting the first Olympic gold medal in the certain kind of sport. (I write it after the kind of sport in brackets.) Within the kinds of sport I tried to list the documents in chronological order if it was allowed by the aesthete. To introduce them I exclusively present such philatelic documents where the contestant's name /portrait (series of Olympic medals in 1972) or their starting number (as Balázs Kiss's) as well as the certain Olympic medal or the number of the medals got on the object referring to the Hungarian participating. I do not always show the participants on Olympic publication (e.g.: Puskás), because it occurs that their figure can be seen e.g. on a World Championship. Our contestants have earned 183 gold-, 158 silver- and 181 bronze medals so far, and now 193 contestants of 17 kinds of sport are named from the all. In the case of team sports the members of the teams were listed if there was space.

On the sheets the contestant's name, event and their achieved result can be found round the document (at the bottom, on top, on the left or right).




A quiz was held in Várpalota to mark the 125th anniversary of Arnold Guttmann's Olympic victory.



2.2. Atletics (15.06.1900.)

Alajos Szololyi in 1896 at the first summer Olympic Games, he wore number one. At this Olympics he won the bronze medal in the 100 m flat race.

In the 100th anniversary edition of the on the left-hand edge of the stamp booklet at the start of the race.

His other results at this Olympics : fourth in the triple jump with 12.30 m, fifth in the 100 m hurdles with 19.5.



In 1896, Alajos Szokolyi competed for Hungary, which was then still part of the Monarchy. Today, Slovakia considers him its own Olympian, which has led to a minor sports diplomacy dispute between the two countries.


To mark the 100th anniversary of the modern Olympic Games, many participating countries commemorated the Games by issuing stamps. Italy, which has hosted both the Summer and Winter Olympic Games over the 100 years. The stamp of 500 lyric on the envelope shows the start of the 100 m flat race final at the Athens Olympics. Szokolyi is fourth from the right.





István Mudin was 2nd in the Hellenic pentathlon at the 1906 Athens Olympics with 25 points, and 3rd in the Hellenic discus throw with 31.91 m.



In Stockholm 1912, Mór Kóczán won the bronze medal in the javelin throw with 55.50 m. He competed under the name Miklós Kovács because his church leaders did not look kindly on his short trousers.




Kóczán also competed in London in 1908 in the following events: discus throw, javelin throw and weight throw. In these he was unplaced. In 1912 he also competed in the right and left javelin and came 12th.
(In the 1924 Paris Olympics he competed for Czechoslovakia.)



Sándor Iharos (Israel) finished 25th in the 1500 m flat in Helsinki in 1952 with 3:56.0. Iharos did not compete in the 1956 Olympics due to personal problems. He was considered a favourite, having set 7 world records in six events in 1955. In 1960 he finished 10th in the 5000 m flat in Rome in 14:11.4. In the same event, he was 11th in the 10,000 m flat in 29:15.8.



3. Winner Olympic performance. (22.02.2018.)

The Hungarian Olympic Committee celebrated its 125th anniversary in 2020.

To mark the occasion, a stamp block was issued with the number of Olympic medals won by Hungarian athletes.

To these numbers must be added the number of medals won at the Tokyo Summer Olympics and the Beijing Winter Olympics.

In Beijing, our athletes won 1 gold and 2 bronze medals.



In 2021, our speed skaters' equipment will be on display at the Olympic history exhibition in Millenáris Park.

Thus, the skates of Hungary's first individual Olympic champion - Liu Shaoang - were on display.

The interesting thing about the stamp used at Millenáris is that the second line was cut out because it was incorrectly included. In the case of the sporting shooters, the full text of the stamp is visible.
