


Castelli d'Italia natural colors



The visual collection

The "Castelli d'Italia" definitive series consist of 37 stamps and is therefore the largest ordinary Italian definitive one. This number of values was determined by the long period of use and so by the issue of further values, adapting to the new postal rates. The issuance period begins in 1980 and ends in 1997. In addition, 14 values have been produced, on coil, for vending machines. Moreover, additional four stamps (200-250-300 and 450 Lire value) were officially re-printed lately, in the nineties, (1994) using the rotogravure system. During the entire production period, many reprints of almost all values were made, using the same printing method but not identical colors, so for this definitive series the colors differences are remarkable.

This collection shows for the first time ever, the natural colors that belongs to "Castelli d'Italia" stamps set. Not only tones and shades are listed and coded but also some important colors features. All the stamps came from a careful selection giving me the ability to describe their peculiarity in the best possible way. Envelopes were chosen for the rarity of stamps used on them, all items anyway were selected to represent the true colors and their use. Not only based on Italian philatelic specialized catalogues but also and above all from my research, analyzing more than 3 millions of Castelli stamps here you will see both well known varieties and unavoidably, unreleased and unknown new features.

As an Italian stamps collector I started to make specialization studies on Italian Republic stamps about 20 years ago, "Castelli d'Italia" series took all my passion and my time in the last 7 years. Involved in many philatelic Italian clubs as AFIS, CIFO, UFS and USFI, I've been writing many articles and a book which is the completion of all my Castelli's research. To be able in color coding I've been studying all the color scales, from Pantone to Munsell method, the RGB system, the CYMK system including the Stanley Gibbons color scale. Last but not least I also practiced alteration on stamps using different kind of acids, developing the knowledge to recognise an adulterated color from a genuine one.

During the long research on Castelli's colors, I could not avoid thinking about the IV Sardinia series, the most collected one, precisely because of the color varieties that are being discovered from time to time. Although almost two centuries have passed since its birth and distribution, the IV Sardinia series still fascinates many collectors.

I hope the same will happen to the Castelli series to which many shades belong in despite that printing methods and colors production are so different nowadays. The phenomenon has again expressed itself in a striking way.







As you can see the fourth piece starting from left has the color of the bush of a predominant shade of green, which differs from the rest of the specimens; this is repeated throughout the vertical row of the entire sheet, this is how the tone here encoded as the **I3** is born
Another peculiarity of this block is the clearer sky on the specimens in the second row to the right.

Color infiltrations in chalcographic printed Castelli.

A phenomenon that can occur during the printing of chalcographic stamps is the color infiltration. This "accident" creates valuable occasional varieties that make the study of this series even more interesting.






Chapter IV - Castelli printed on "colored paper"

Colored paper for stamp printing does not exist in Italy. When the paper is colored is because the paper feed roller or the print roller are dirty of color. That's why a veil of this color is left on part of it or on its entire surface. The veil of color has to be exactly as one of the colors used during the printing, otherwise it's not a natural variety. Here are the values with this characteristic.



Chapter V - Colors on the back

From Giovanni Riggi di Numana and Giovanni Martina studies, this phenomenon is not described as a set-off but as "color passed on the back". Their supposition is vinyl or aniline ink was used, which being more liquid is absorbed by the paper. In truth it is not known with certainty how this could happen. I have discovered other values with the same characteristic shown here, including the 350 Lire which was produced with chalcographic printing.

The 10 and 50 Lire are presenting a transfer of color from the piece glued to them due to fresh and still wet ink.

Chapter VI - Luminescent colors

I found some values of 100 Lire which present a particular color of red in the light of Wood. Riggi di Numana's studies on luminescence have been useful to me but have not solved my question, also for castles the luminescent inks? Or, are we facing to phosphorescent inks?

One thing is sure, this was unknown before my discovery and the values of castles that show this characteristic are very few, this phenomenon is also present on the values of 150, 550 and 800 Lire. To understand better what I'm talking about, I show you a couple of values from the past, such as the famous 10 Lire Siracusana and the less known 50 Centesimi "Parmeggiani".




Chapter VII - Fluorescent colors on back side

Another interesting and unique recent discovery is about fluorescent colors on the back, only on Castelli's series. As far as we know it's the first kind variety existing all over the world.
The values of 900 and 1000 Lire proved to be very common, the 350 and 750 less common, difficult to find the 400 the 500 the 600 the 700 and the 800 Lire.



The 350 Lire has the black fluorescence of the upper triangles in its background,
Black fluorescence cannot be identified by looking at it from the front.



400 Lire present a heavy blue fluorescence visible also observing the front of the stamp under the wood light.

500 Lire black fluorescence is noticeable only on the back of the stamp.

Also for the 600, 700, 750 and 800 Lire specimens, black luminescence color is noticeable on the back only .



For 900 and 1000 Lire the black heavy fluorescence is
Noticeable both on the font and back side of stamps.



Chapter VIII – Castelli on coil peculiarity

Although this emission does not offer much in terms of colors, surprisingly shows different values with ink fluorescence on the back. Here are shown all the values so far discovered, both for colors and fluorescence.

Chapter XI – *Fake and manipulated colors*

As always been in philately since his early days, counterfeiters and dodgers always tried to defraud collectors with intervention, copies or modifications to the nature of the stamp. Some specimens defined in the past as "print start" results, are shown here as they do not respond correctly to the light of wood and infrared, revealing when present, evident spots of "pouring" especially the glue on the back, highlighting the tampering with various acids.

Chapter XIII – Misplaced colors

When printing is carried out in several steps, colors may shift. The characteristic is defined as "out of register colors".




